



Laser Vein Post Treatment Instructions

- You may use ice packs 3-4 times a day for 15 minutes at a time to alleviate any redness and discomfort. You may also take acetaminophen (Tylenol) for any discomfort
- Care should be taken to prevent any trauma to the treated area(s) for the first 48 hours following your treatment. Do not scratch, rub, or pick the skin over the treated areas.
- If the skin is broken or a blister has occurred, apply antibiotic ointment twice a day until healed (7-10 days). Keep the area clean and covered. Avoid ALL sun exposure to the area. We also ask that you promptly call our office to let us know that you have experienced a blister or crusting.
- Sun block with a minimum of 30 SPF must be worn EVERY DAY. Avoid direct sun exposure and tanning beds for 7 days.
- Avoid any strenuous workouts, hot tubs, hot baths, saunas or spas for 48 hours after treatment.
- Remember that you will be able to see the veins we treated today. The veins that have been treated with the laser must now be reabsorbed by your body and depending upon the size of the veins. That process may actually take many months for that process to be complete. The smaller veins tend to fade gradually over 3-4 months, and the larger veins can take up to 6-9 months to disappear. When you return for your follow-up visits, we will be able to determine which veins will require additional treatment at that time. It is also normal to see a "bruised-like" effect over the larger veins along with a palpable "rope-like" sensation for 3-4 months. This too will gradually fade and disappear.
